Easy Italian Meatball Soup for a Cold Winter Day



Ingredients

- 3 cups water
- 2 (14 ounce) cans diced tomatoes with onion and garlic, undrained
- 2 (14 ounce) cans beef broth
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- 1 (16 ounce) package frozen cooked Italian-style meatballs
- 2 cups frozen Italian-blend vegetables
- 1 cup small star-shaped dried pasta
- ½ cup grated Parmesan cheese

Directions

- 1. Stir water, tomatoes, beef broth, and Italian seasoning together in a large pot; bring to a boil.
- 2. Add meatballs, Italian-blend vegetables, and pasta to the pot; bring to a boil, reduce heat to medium-low, and cook until meatballs are heated through and the pasta is tender, about 10 minutes.
- 3. Ladle soup into bowls and garnish with Parmesan cheese.
